## ARRL Withdraws Bandwidth Proposal

The ARRL has asked the FCC to allow withdrawal of RM-11306, its proposal to regulate by bandwidth rather than mode. There were more than one thousand comments filed with the FCC on the proposal. They ran largely in opposition to the ARRL proposal. The League has not indicated when or if they will refile at a later time.

Amateur Radio Newsline explained the proposal this way: "No longer would there be the traditional band segments dedicated to a given mode or modes like CW and SSB. Instead, anyone could operate anywhere as long as his or her signal did not exceed a specific bandwidth for a particular spectral parcel. This meant that in a given band one might see a legacy mode such as SSB mixed with all sorts of emerging digital modes that have yet to be devised. This change in itself was one that a lot of folks seemed to have a problem understanding or simply opposed because they oppose any sort of change."

Automated digital messaging was another often mentioned objection. Emergency communications involved amateurs have pressed for development of an automated network to maintain amateur radio's position as a support organization. Opponents fear automated stations would lead to a massive interference.

## Solar Cycle 24

If you have been waiting for improved D X conditions on the High Frequency bands, you are going to have to be patient a bit longer. So says the NOAA Space Environment Center which led a prediction panel that issued the forecast at its annual Space Weather Workshop in Boulder, Colorado. Expected to start last fall, the delayed onset of Solar Cycle 24 has stymied the panel. It also left them evenly split on whether a weak or strong period of solar storms lies ahead, but neither group predicts a record-breaker.

One disagreement among the current panel members centers on the importance of magnetic fields around the sun's poles as the previous cycle decays. End-cycle polar fields are the bedrock of the approach predicting a weak Cycle 24. The strong-cycle forecasters place more importance on other precursors extending over a several-cycle history. Another clue will be whether Cycle 24 sunspots appear by mid 2008. If not, the strong-cycle group might change its forecast.

## Who Are We?

We are one hundred-seventy-six strong. We live in six states, but the majority of us live within Washington County. Most of us are male, but eighteen percent of us are female, and this percentage has more than doubled in the last five years. Between one-quarter and one-third of us on average attend our monthly meeting. Twenty percent of us did not attend a monthly club meeting in 2006. Yet, even non-attenders are connected through other activities and our monthly journal, The OSCILLATOR.

Two of our members are 88 years old this year, fourteen percent of us are in our 80s. Another fourteen percent are at the other end of our age range: Three percent in our 20s, two percent in our 30s, and nine percent in our 40s. Nearly half of us are in our 50s and 60s (forty-eight percent). About a quarter of us are in our 70s. Our average age has been decreasing over the past five years as new members join us.

We are interested in social events, community service, and support of emergency communications and general purpose repeaters. We have a history of providing leadership to Oregon Section and the Northwestern Division. That history continues today with several of our members serving Oregon Section in appointed roles.

One hundred seventy-three of us are licensed amateur radio operators. Thirty-one percent of us hold the Extra Class License, with another 9 percent holding an Advanced Class License. The second highest number in our club are General Class licensees (thirty percent) after seven recently upgraded in a club-sponsored series. Yet, we have twenty-eight percent holding the Technician Class or Technician Plus CW license.

As we approach our thirtieth anniversary as a club, we look forward to the future of our venture as a Club.

## Contest Group - 7<sup>th</sup> Call Area QSO Party

Saturday, May 5<sup>th</sup> was a busy day for quite a number of our OTVARC members. The morning started with the final General Class upgrade session, coordinated by Everett Curry W6ABM followed by the regular VE testing session with Carl Clawson WS7L and his team of VEC's. By mid-afternoon our club had seven newly-minted General Class operators.

At the same time the OTVARC Contest Group was preparing to operate using club call sign W7OTV in the second annual 7<sup>th</sup> Call Area QSO Party. The "7QP" contest runs for 18-hours, with 7-land stations working everybody. Stations outside the 7<sup>th</sup> call area work 7's with county multiplier credits. If all counties are activated, it would be possible to work 259 different geographic divisions.

The contest organizers, (Central Oregon DX Club) picked an interesting weekend for the event. Several other contests were on the air as well, including:

- Indiana state QSO party.
- New England states QSO party.
- ARI International DX contest.

By the end of the day W7OTV operators had worked stations in all three of these contests as well as 7QP.

Because several of our regular contest group members were also involved with the class and the VE session, we didn't go on the air until 12:00 noon, even though the contest started at 6:00 AM. With the late start we set out to operate a laid back event, with great success! As people dropped by during the afternoon, socializing was the main activity at times, with operating in second place.

Most activity was on 20-meters during the day, with a few contacts on 40 as well. Several Italian stations were heard and two were added to the log. After a relaxing barbecue dinner we settled down and concentrated on 40-meters for a while to add to our multipliers. A brief check back on 20-meters added to our totals and netted two more surprise DX contacts, one with New Zealand, (4:30 PM in their afternoon) and the other with Estonia, where it was approximately 7:30 AM, their time.

W7OTV stayed on the air until 10:00 PM with the following results in the log:

- 60 contacts total.
- 19 states worked.
- 22 contest multipliers.
- 4 DX countries worked.
- 2,640 contest points.
- 4 different contests worked.
